# Bowling green to open for season on April 20

The bowling green will open for the season on Saturday April 20. Green coordinator Peter Lamb told the March committee meeting that the green would be prepared by Avonmore at the end of March. The grass would be cut at 5mm for the start of the season. He said he had purchased a hawk kite bird scarer which would be flown from a 12ft pole at the edge of the green from time to time to protect it from bird damage. The wooden surround would be repaired and repainted and 75m of ditch cushions would be put in. # Rink booking times are formalised

The Bowls Committee has considered formalising booking times and has decided that rinks should only be booked for a maximum of the following periods: Morning - 11.00 to 13.30

Afternoon - 13.30 to 17.00\*

Evening - 17.00\* onward.

\* It is recognised that on occasion, e.g. Friday's Gala, the rinks are available earlier in the evening.

Captain Martin Dean said: "Matches will, as always, take precedence in rink booking. The hierarchy for rink booking is County, S Warks., Leagues, external club competitions (e.g. Top Club), internal competitions (incl. WTT), roll ups. Of course, some common sense may need to be applied on occasion, e.g. if a game is nearing its conclusion but has taken longer than anticipated. "At present, because the maintenance staff only work days, the green is watered in the morning. When mowing the green is also taken into account it is not possible to commence bowling before 11.00.

"The watering cycle through the various sprinklers takes around one hour 15 mins. If we have sufficient volunteers who were willing individually, from time to time, to undertake the watering on a weekday evening then we could make the morning start time earlier. The watering process is relatively straightforward as it is time controlled across the six sprinklers. "Peter Lamb has indicated that he is willing to instruct volunteers in this task. Once the cycle is underway there is little to do until it finishes, except perhaps adjourn to the bar for a glass of wine or a pint.

"In the spirit of equality I should point out that the role is not gender specific.

"Please let me know if you are willing to volunteer to help with the summer watering of the green. Remember the more volunteers the fewer occasions each person will be required to cover."
