		Minimising contact between members/crews Crew rowing should be in consistent crews (including the cox). Coxes to be allocated a headset microphone and a visor each to take home. Crew members to carry their own blades to the water.		Rowing Captains All members	During training When boating	
		Track & Trace Members to book sessions for themselves only and to record any crew members on their booking via Clubspark. This means that should a club member test positive for Covid-19, any affected individuals can be quickly identified and contacted.		All members	Before coming to the club for training	
		Social Distancing To ensure social distancing members may only go out in crew boats with up to a maximum of 5 members on board (i.e. coxed fours). Coxes must wear face covering and face visor (or face covering and goggles). The maximum number of people per session is 12. This includes coxes and any coaches in the boating area. River slots will be reduced to six to prevent members congregating around boatshed area and to keep session numbers below 12. When in boats, crews to row full crew at all times, to maintain distance between each other, avoid turning round or shouting. Where 2m distancing becomes difficult (e.g. when carrying boats), crew members advised to wear face covering and to bring a plastic bag to put it in when in the boat. Coaches advised to carry a spare face mask with them for the 'patient' in case a rescue is required. Use of the coaching launch is allowed with committee's permission, and must be cleaned before and after use. PPE/face covering must be worn if more than 1 person on board (e.g. if used as a Safety Launch).		All members	At all times
